



— CONVENTION *of* STATES —

WHEN TO USE IT AND WHEN TO USE AN ARTICLE V CONVENTION

This document serves as guidelines for the phrase “*Convention of States*,” in regard to the submission of our organization’s logo trademark and wordmark, and branding there within



ONLY USE “*Convention of States*” as a **proper noun**, when referring to the organization itself.



Example: **When asking people to join the organization as a grassroots activists or sign the petition**



Example: **When writing about the organization**



DO NOT USE “*Convention of States*” or “*convention of states*” to refer to the process laid out in the U.S. Constitution under **Article V**.



DO NOT USE “*constitutional convention*” when referring to the **process of an Article V convention**.

When talking about **THE PROCESS OF A CONVENTION**, **PLEASE USE:**



✓ **An Article V convention**



✓ **A convention for proposing amendments**



✓ **A convention called under Article V of the US Constitution.**

Any other variation that does not use the words “Convention of States.”
